

- Most of them are related to beverages (especially wines) or food
- There is one AO for the buttons

#### Jaffa oranges case

- "JAFFA" was registered in 1968 for citrus fruits grown in various areas of Israel.
- All the AOs and GIs that have been registered so far in Israel, except for JAFFA, originate abroad.
- Israel joined as a member of the Lisbon Agreement in the 1960s,
   mainly to protect this geographical indication JAFFA





